Subject:	Regarding the permit applications from C&C Automotive Refinishing and Downtown Collision Center, for each business to install their own automotive paint spray booth that would use coatings that emit parachlorobenzotrifluoride (PCBTF), ethyl benzene, isopropyl alcohol (isopropanol), toluene, and xylenes which are designated as toxic air contaminants by the California Air Resources Board (CARB).
Who is the SMAQMD?	The Sacramento Metropolitan Air Quality Management District (SMAQMD) is the local government agency that regulates stationary sources of air pollution such as manufacturing facilities, industrial sites, coating operations, gasoline stations and many others. The SMAQMD evaluates the air emissions from each project prior to approving a permit. SMAQMD's purpose is to ensure that the air emissions associated with a project meet all local, state, and federal requirements in order to protect public health.
Why are you Receiving this Notice?	State law (California Health and Safety Code section 42301.6) requires that prior to approving an Authority to Construct permit for a facility that 1) emits toxic air contaminants and 2) is located within 1,000 feet of a K-12 school site, the SMAQMD must notify the parents or guardians of children attending all schools within a quarter-mile radius and all addresses within a 1,000-feet radius of the facility. SMAQMD must allow for a 30-day public review and comment period before taking final action on the permit application.
Toxic Air Contaminants	The proposed projects will emit the aforementioned primary substances identified as toxic air contaminants by the California Air Resources Board (CARB). See the Engineering Evaluation of each project posted on SMAQMD's website to view the full list of air pollutants that were analyzed for this project.
How are the air contaminants from this project reduced or controlled?	The proposed paint spray booth(s) and/or paint spray prep station(s) will be required to use materials (coatings, solvents, cleaners, etc.) that are compliant with SMAQMD Rules and use High-Volume Low-Pressure Spray Equipment (or equivalent spray application equipment), which limits the emissions from the coating operation. Each business will be required to keep records of the materials used and SMAQMD staff will inspect each facility on a regular basis to ensure compliance with all air quality standards.

Project Analysis	The SMAQMD analyzed the projects for compliance with applicable air quality regulations. The analysis identified the amount and types of air emissions that are expected to be emitted from the proposed project and the effect of those air emissions on public health. The SMAQMD has determined that the health risk resulting from the toxic air contaminant emissions from the proposed project are within acceptable levels and that the project is expected to comply with all other local, state and federal air quality requirements.
