

Visitors & Volunteers

Parents are welcome and encouraged to visit the school any time during our business hours. All visitors to the school must sign in at the front office, where you will be given a visitor's badge to wear during your stay. Please sign out in the office when leaving. Parents and guardians are welcome to visit their child's classroom, but are asked to make arrangements at least one day in advance. If you'd like to meet with the principal or other staff member, please call ahead to make an appointment. One time visits, observations and presentations may be conducted without volunteer clearance. However, regular visits of more than 15 minutes per school day require parents and guardians to undergo the volunteer clearance process detailed below.

VOLUNTEERS & FIELD TRIP DRIVERS

Your involvement at school is essential to building our school culture and community. We welcome your energy, your time and expertise, big or small. Please consider becoming a STEAM or garden docent, room parent, recess or library volunteer, LCO or School Site Council member. Please fill out the SCUSD <u>Volunteer Form</u> and return to our Main Office. Your learner's teacher might have other possible ways to help – Please note that every class is different. Please check with your child's teacher, and we'll see you on campus!

Volunteer Requirements:

Please complete the following before volunteering:

A current and completed volunteer registration form.

A copy of a recent TB Test or chest x-ray form/ card indicating a negative result.

Field trips: Fingerprint clearance is required to transport/chaperone students on field trips.

Communication

Let's talk! Building community and relationships early makes unexpected events better to address. We invite you to talk to your learner's teacher and principal early and often. It takes a village.

Drop Off & Dismissal

Though we are a small school, we can create major traffic jams in the morning and after-school. For the safety of our children, PLEASE do not double park and please do not jaywalk. We kindly ask that you safely park your vehicle and walk up to the school. We have several buses for students with special needs. Please do not park in the bus zone.

Drop-off:

For the safety of students, please do not drop-off students before 8:45 AM unless your student is enrolled in STEAM Academy. Drop off at the Main Entrance or side Garden Gate (17th & F ST.).

Pick-up

EK-3rd -Main Entrance 4th-6th-Garden Gate (17th & F ST.)

At dismissal, teachers walk their students to the gates for pick-up. Students who participate in STEAM Academy are picked-up in class at their respective dismissal times.

Attendance

It is extremely important that all students attend school every day. Please support your students by getting them to school on time every day. If your student is absent, please communicate the date and reason with the front office staff. You may report absences by phone, <u>school website</u>, note, or in person.

Tardies

Students arriving late should report to the front office to sign before heading to class.

Early Dismissals

Parents and Guardians can come to the office to sign out their student for every early dismissal. If someone new is picking up, please notify the office prior to the dismissal. You can add additional people to your student's pick-up in the office. All people signing students out for an early dismissal must be 18 or over and have a valid ID for student safety.

Dress Code

We are a uniform school. The building of our Locomotive community is central to our core values. It is important for our students to feel like they are an integral part of our school culture. The following is our uniform policy:

- Dark blue bottoms (navy blue); pants, Blue Jeans, navy shorts, navy skirts, navy skorts, navy jumpers, navy leggings, navy dresses
- Solid White, Navy, or Light Blue Polo/collared shirts
- Washington School Uniform shirts & sweatshirts
- Sweaters, sweatshirts, in navy blue, light blue, or white
- Tank tops or undershirts are not considered uniform tops. Straps on tops must be at least 3 fingers wide. Spaghetti straps are not permitted.
- Short Shorts, Bicycle shorts and cut-off shorts are not allowed
- No open sandals, flip-flops or "heelies"

Parents/Guardians may be contacted if their student is not dressed appropriately for the school day and can either bring a change of clothes/shoes, or a loaner set can be given to the student (if available).

Electronic Equipment, Cell Phones & Personal Items

Student cell phones, tablets, and devices such as Apple watches are allowed on campus, but all student devices (cell phones, tablets, and smartwatches) must remain in students' backpacks during school hours (8:45a.m.-3:07p.m.) and turned off unless given permission by a staff member to use in an emergency. Smartwatches may not be worn during school hours. Cell phones, tablets, and smartwatches are not allowed at recess. If parents wish to leave a message for a student during the school day, they should call the school office. Cell phones, tablets, and smartwatches may NOT be used to take and share pictures on campus or be used for social media purposes. Students may use devices before & after school to communicate with parents and caregivers, but students are not allowed to share images, messages, games, information, etc. on their devices with other students while on campus, even outside school hours. Devices out during school hours (8:45a.m.-3:07p.m.), will be taken to the office and may be picked up after school. Washington Elementary School does not take responsibility for any electronic devices that students bring to school, and will not have the resources to investigate theft or damage of such items.

Restorative Behavior

As a school, we take a personal restorative approach to discipline. We are intentional with our school-wide practices that include Mindfulness Yoga, morning circles/closing circles, check-in's and celebrations and appreciations. Our collective whole student approach is meant to be proactive as we guide our students in becoming leaders and empowered in their own learning and growth. Additionally, we have 6th grade Peer Mediators trained by our School Social Worker.
